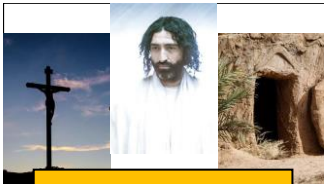
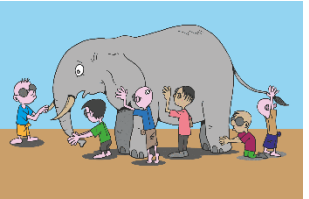


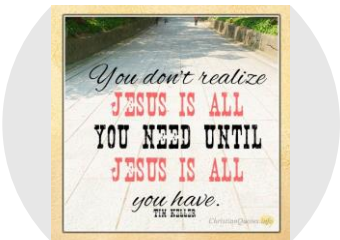

Questions for our discipleship groups this week

Why do you think that the Queen was vocal about who Jesus is? Why not keep a bit quieter?!

How is the story of the blind men and the elephant helpful for us as limited human beings? When it comes to matters of God and faith, in what ways is it useful and what are the pitfalls?

Read John 14:1-10:

- In what ways does Jesus reveal God the Father to us (v.9)?
- How would you explain to someone that Jesus is the way and the truth and the life, and that no-one comes to the Father except through him (v.6)?
- As our society tends to focus on 'me' (Expressive individualism), how has it been a challenge for you in sharing the truth of Jesus?

Read Matthew 26:36-46:

- What was Jesus going through?
- What is his attitude towards the Father?
- How does this passage show us that the cross never claims to be an optional extra for us in coming to the Father?

"You don't realise Jesus is all you need, until Jesus is all you have" (Tim Keller). How might God use crises in people's lives to bring people to Jesus?

If Jesus "came from the Father, full of grace and truth," (John 1:14) how might we be more like him, both truthful in our witness but also gracious in our approach?

In prayer, share one person each that you'd love to trust in Jesus and find the way to the Father. What help do you need in sharing the Gospel with them?
