And these wounds are a story You'll use

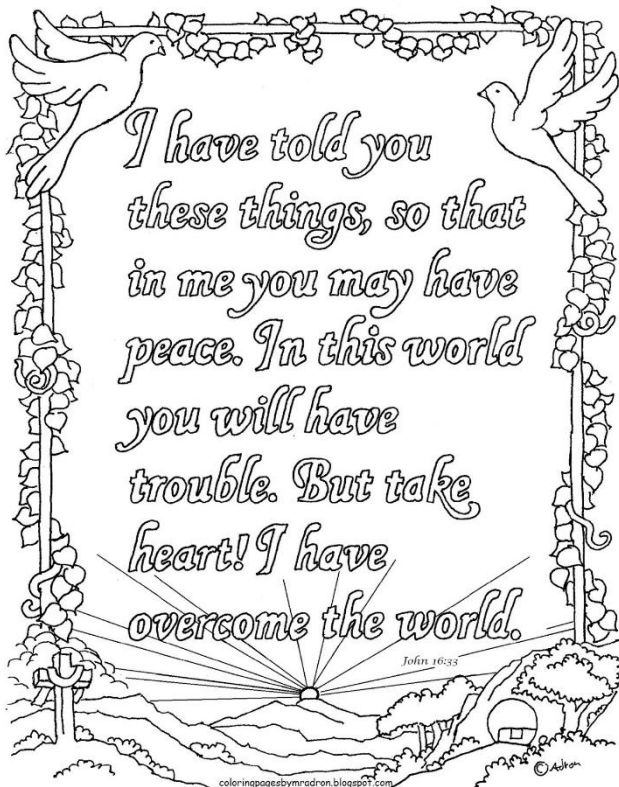
So I'm thankful for the scars

So forever I am thankful for the scars

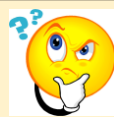
I can see, I can see
