7 churches – 7 the number that represents perfection

- To the angel of the church in... (Unseen world)
- An announcement that describes Jesus
- An assessment of the health of the church 'I Know'
- A message given to the church
- An appeal keep going! Repent!
- A promise that is set in eternity

Each church represents one aspect of the challenges facing the church until Jesus returns.

- I. Ephesu
  - I. Ephesus: Active but distant from the Gospel First Love
  - II. Smyrna: Faithful in suffering
- III. Pergamum: Faithful but too willing to compromise
- IV. Thyatira: Sexual purity
  - V. Sardis: Active but not connected to God's will and purpose
    - VI. Philadelphia: Faithfully proclaiming the Gospel
- VII. Laodicea: Complacent and proud
- 1. Jesus wants us to recognise what makes up a healthy church
  - One that knows Jesus is present
  - One that is alert to and doing what God wants
  - One that stays connected to the Spirit, The Gospel, the Word of God and the Grace of God
- 2. It is Jesus who opens the door of mission for his churches
  - An open door for mission whatever the circumstances
  - Persecution or comfort Jesus goes before us as the faithful witness
  - He calls us to be a faithful witness following up His faithful witness

- 3. The church must resist the temptation of pride and complacency
  - Self-reliance is asking for rebuke lampstand removed!

## 7 Marks of a healthy church:

- 1. Connected to the Gospel, First love
- 2. Faithful in the face of persecution and suffering
- 3. Take Holy Living seriously
- 4. Take sexual purity seriously
- 5. Take God's word seriously, listening and doing
- 6. Faithful in gospel proclamation
- 7. Take care not to become proud nor complacent
