- 1. Testimony: Trustworthy and True
 - Revelation 1:2;22:6,16,20
 - Truth to hold on to when life gets tough
 - i. A foundation to build our lives on The word of God and the testimony of Jesus
 - ii. Hope to live for Jesus is coming back as Saviour and Judge
 - iii. Present help in a world that suffers Grace and Peace
- 2. Testimony Passed down
 - The whole letter is a message from God
 - Passed on to Jesus to the Angel to John to us!
 - For the blessing of the church that witnesses in a suffering world. 1:3, 22:7
- 3. Testimony of love!
 - Jesus, Saviour and Judge Nothing is beyond him
 - Do not be afraid! Write what you have seen
 - AD 70 90 a time of great suffering for Christians
 Matthew 5: 11 12
 - John is in exile because of the Word of God and the Testimony of Jesus 1:9

Digging Deeper

Read Matthew 5 11 - 12; Matthew 10: 32 - 39 and 2 Corinthians 1: 3 - 11

- 7. Is apathy harder to live with than direct opposition? How do people respond to you when they know you are a Christian? (Home, Work, Friends)

 - c. What do you hope to gain as i) an individual ii) as a group and iii) as a church?
