1. Final judgement - Chapter 15

- The seven last plagues.
 - With them God's wrath is complete
 - 'Just and true are your ways'
- The tabernacle of the testimony is opened
 - The ten commandments
- The glory of God is seen in salvation and judgement

2. Stay awake - Chapter 16

- You are just in these judgements
 - Similar to the plagues in Egypt
- We reap what we sow verse 6
 - No repentance they curse God
- Battle lines are drawn evil spirits gather the kings of the world
- Armageddon looms

3. Be wise - Chapter 17

- The woman and the beast
- The unfaithful and the enticing judged
 - Satan works behind the scenes
 - Attractive but rotten
- Power and Authorities political and economic oppress and tempt

4. Come out! - Chapter 18

- Babylon falls
 - God judges the nations
 - Adultery and excessive luxuries
- Self-centred living Verse 7 (God opposes the proud)
- In one hour such great wealth has been brought to ruin Verse 16

5. Come in! - Chapter 19

- The heavenly throne room of chapters 4,5
 - God is praised
 - Salvation and glory and power
 - Just and true are his judgements
- These are the true words of God!

 - C. When you think of Jesus coming like a thief in the night, how well prepared are you for his coming?
