All Loved up – Song of Songs 1:1 – 2:7

### Holy Desires 1: 1 -4

- God created us sexual beings
- The beloved wants intimacy a kiss that longs for more
- 'Let the king bring me into his chambers'

#### The Friends 1:4

Sexuality – private but public

# Mirror, mirror on the wall 1:5-7

- Dark am I yet lovely
- My brothers were angry with me
- She longs for someone in her life
- She becomes vulnerable and goes looking...

#### The friends 1:8

- They encourage love
- They encourage responsibility

#### Love talk 1:9 - 2:6

- The lover speaks you drive me mad
- A duet begins a vocabulary of love develops
- He is taken by her beauty and promises to make her more beautiful
- She invites him and he responds
- They enjoy one another they make time for one another

# The beloved speaks to her friends 2:7

- Peace is important in a relationship
- Rest and patience are important too
- This is explosive stuff Handle with care!

## **Digging Deeper**

- 1. What are your hopes and fears in studying the Song of Songs together?
- 2. Why do we find sex and relationships challenging to discuss? Is this something as British people we find challenging. Any ideas as to why?

# Read Song of Songs 1:1 – 2:7

- 1. How do we treat something that is very powerful?
- 2. What happens to the Beloved as she falls head over heels for her lover?
- 3. In verse 4 and 8 the friends join in. There is a communal aspect throughout the Song of Songs. What part do the friends play in this stage of the song? How does this help those who are not currently in a committed relationship understand their role? What does Romans 12: 9 16 teach us about our life in community?
- 4. In verse 5 she reflects on her experience growing up. She is concerned about her personal appearance. It seems that body image is not just a present day trauma! What is it about falling in love that causes us to think about our looks?
- 5. Who takes the lead in the dating? What is the impact on the Lover? Verse 9 11, 15,  $17 \cdot 2:2$
- 6. There is a lot of anticipation of more in this opening section of the Psalm. What is the beloved saying to her lover? Verse 2-4, 12-14, 16, 2: 3-5
- 7. What is the picture that is sung about in verse 6?
- 8. What does the refrain in verse 7 mean? Why does this come at this point in the song?
