## 1. The finish line is revealed 21: 1 - 8

- The Holy City coming down from heaven prepared as a bride
- The dwelling of God is with men no more separation
- God's action wipes away every tear
- The old order of things has passed away

#### 2. It is done! 21: 6 - 8

- Water of life and the joy of adoption
- Those who rejected Jesus are separated out
- The unrepentant judged and the second death

## 3. Come and see the bride! 21: 9 - 26

- The city comes down from heaven
- 12 is repeated 6 times! 12,14,16,17,20,21
- Old Testament tribes, New Testament Apostles the whole of God's people
- The new city a perfect cube No Temple!
- No sun or moon God's glory its light!
- No sin, nothing impure!

## 4. The life of the new heaven and new earth 22:1 - 5

- The water of life
- The tree of life, healing for the nations
- They will see His face
- His name will be on their foreheads
- They will reign forever
