Heart Matters – Faith that stands firm

1 Kings 18: 41 – 19: 9

- 1. The story so far
 - Glory to ruin
 - Ahab did more evil in the eyes of the Lord than any of those before him.
 - Elijah prays and there is a drought for 3 years
 - The contest on Mount Carmel
 - 1 against 450 the Living God against Baal
 - "The Lord, he is God, The Lord, he is God"
- 2. Wholehearted a heart for God's glory
 - 450 prophets of Baal killed
 - God is Holy, God is just, God is merciful
 - Deuteronomy 20 Judgement
 - Matthew 26:22 Mercy
 - Revelation 19: 11-21 Judgement
- 3. Wholehearted Putting sin to death
 - For our struggle is not against flesh and blood but...
 - Elijah prays!
 - Elijah runs! Man beats chariot.
- 4. Wholehearted working with God
 - God acts the sacrifice burns
 - Elijah prays rain returns
 - Elijah a man like us!
 - God draws us into a partnership with him
- 5. Wholehearted and realistic
 - Jezebel doesn't give up
 - Elijah was afraid
 - I have had enough Lord!
 - Rest food and shelter.
 - The battle won the war continues

Week 5 Elijah Prays, Elijah runs!

Read 1 Kings 18: 41 – 46

- 1. How can Elijah tell Ahab that there is the sound of a heavy rain?
- 2. Ahab goes off to eat and drink. What does Elijah do? What do we learn from Elijah's priorities?
- 3. Elijah prays persistently. Why doesn't he give up? What areas of your life require persistent prayer? What do we learn from these passages that help us to keep going?
- 4. Elijah outruns the king's chariot. Divine power! Is this something for all God's people?

Read 1 Kings 19 1 – 2

- 1. Ahab tells Jezebel what happened on Mt Carmel. What do you think were Ahab's thoughts and emotions like in this conversation? What caused these thoughts and emotions?
- 2. Jezebel proves a formidable enemy of Elijah and God. Why are we surprised by the power and tenacity of evil?
- 3. Ahab stands by as his queen acts to have Elijah killed. Having seen God's power on Mt Carmel, why can't he deal with Jezebel?

Read 1 Kings 19 3 - 9

- 1. Ministry is hard work and draining. Elijah threatened and now exhausted wants to give up. Is this a part of faith or is he proving faithless? What makes you want to give up?
- 2. God cares for Elijah. Hospitality has a healing impact. How do we care well for one another?
- 3. God provides rest, food and warmth for Elijah. How do create times of rest and recuperation into our church's life and ministries?
