1 Kings 19: 9 - 21

- 1. 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' 9 11
 - Hiding for my life!
 - Elijah is where God has told him to be!
 - Elijah focuses on what he has done The failure of God's people, the death threats he has run from.
 - Elijah is invited into the presence of God!
- 2. God whispers! 11 14
 - A great and powerful wind
 - An earthquake
 - Fire
 - Still small voice! What are you doing here Elijah?
 - Elijah repeats verse 10!
- 3. God directs 15 18
 - Go back!
 - Anoint Hazael king of Aram
 - Jehu king of Israel
 - Elisha as your successor
 - By the way, you are not alone there are 7,000 others!
- 4. Elisha is called
 - The cloak symbolised his call
 - Elisha responds wholeheartedly
 - He sets out to follow and become Elijah's attendant!
 - God has not given up on his people!

Digging Deeper

Read 1 Kings 19: 9 -11

- 1. Where is Elijah and why is he there?
- 2. What do you think lies behind God's question to Elijah?
- 3. Elijah focuses on the events around him, telling God what God knew already. In what ways do we do the same?
- 4. What does God want for Elijah? What is best for us? and how do we discipline ourselves to focus on that?

Read 1 Kings 19: 11 – 14

- 1. Why would God go through the sequence of Wind, Earthquake and Fire?
- 2. Why does Elijah cover his head with his cloak when he hears God's voice?
- 3. Why would God repeat the same question to Elijah? Why does Elijah repeat himself? What might we learn from this?

Read 1 Kings 19: 15 - 18

- 1. Elijah's time away in hiding is brought to a close. He is told to anoint kings! What lies behind what God is saying to Elijah through these instructions?
- 2. How do these help us remain faithful in our current culture?
- 3. Is verse 18 a rebuke or an encouragement? Do you feel as if you are all alone? How might we help one another when we feel isolated?

Read 1 Kings 19: 19 - 21

- 1. Elisha responds to Elijah's appointment of him what does he do?
- 2. Read Matthew 10: 37 39. Does this apply to us all or just to God's special people like Elijah and Elisha?
- 3. Elisha has to work an apprenticeship. What should the route to leadership look like for PBC?
