Children and Parents 6: 1-4

- Children obey!
 - Wives were commanded to submit, children obey!
 - Parent's authority over their children is different and stronger than the husbands 'headship' over his wife.
 - This is right! It follows a natural pattern
 - This is God's law for your benefit
 - Children this is a reflection of your relationship with Jesus.
 'In the Lord'
- Father's don't exasperate, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.
 - Self-controlled, gentle and patient!
 - Parents have a primary role in bringing up their children to take their place in society and God's new community.

Slaves and Masters 6: 5-9

- Slaves obey,
 - With respect, fear and sincerity of heart
 - Serve wholeheartedly
 - The reward is from the Lord
- Masters
 - Treat your slaves in the same way
 - Remember you have a master too!
 - Remember you share the same master!
