- 2. Jesus feeds the 5000 Matthew 14: 13 21
 - A heart for God develops a heart of compassion for others
 - We will never have enough but God does!
 - Faith needs exercising for it to stand firm
 - Life lived on the edge!
- 3. A heart for God is a heart for people
 - Elijah and Elisha point to the miracles of Jesus
 - God's grace meets human needs
 - Faithful people are cared for by a God who will meet our needs
